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Data Source and Definitions

The Dubuque MSA includes all of Dubuque County, IA

Lightcast occupation employment data are based on final Lightcast industry data and final Lightcast staffing patterns. Wage estimates are based on Occupational Employment Statistics (QCEW and Non-QCEW Employees classes of worker) and the American Community Survey (Self-Employed and Extended Proprietors). Occupational wage estimates also affected by county-level Lightcast earnings by industry. This report uses data from the following agencies: Iowa Workforce Development.

Earnings include wages, salaries, overtime, and bonuses.

What are Percentile Wages?

A percentile wage shows the percentage of workers in an occupation that earn less than a given wage and the percentage that earn more.
