RESULT: The 2021 poverty rate for the Dubuque Metropolitan Statistical Area sits at 9.3% according to the American Community Survey. Data for 2022 is not yet available.

The site is continually enhanced in response to feedback and suggestions we glean from our HR Action interviews. New tools and enhanced features unveiled in May 2023 to over 190 AccessDubuqueJobs.com investors include:

• Resume folder tool improves tracking of potential applicants with the option to curate collections of resumes in customizable folders from the over 2,000 searchable resumes currently housed on our online resume bank.

• Preview job function adds efficiency and improves accuracy in the job posting process for HR professionals.

• Expanded automatic job import options thanks to added integrations with 44 platforms used by many of our AccessDubuqueJobs.com investors' internal HR processes and purposes.

• Upgrade to the Cloudflare Content Delivery Network to improve the website speed, increase protection of the site from online attacks, and boost SEO rankings.

Greater Dubuque Development aggressively promotes the site and investor job postings through bi-monthly email newsletters, investments in print, digital, and billboard advertising, and management of three social media channels dedicated to AccessDubuqueJobs.com. Investors receive additional representation at on-campus presentations and career fairs attended by our Workforce Solutions team throughout the year. While AccessDubuqueJobs.com began as a website, it has evolved into a robust suite of resources for attracting and retaining regional workforce.

Community Tours

Our community tours showcase how YOU can be great here in the Greater Dubuque region. These 90-minute driving tours, facilitated by our community tour guides, highlight unique community assets and explore Greater Dubuque history and culture while answering questions along the way.

A resource launched in 2009, our community tour program reached the 2,000+ tours milestone this past year. AccessDubuqueJobs.com investors look to this program as a go-to for their HR processes, especially when recruiting top candidates from outside the area.

In 2022-2023, 102 newcomers participated in the program's four sessions with our next class set to kickoff in August 2023.

2022-2023 brought us the inaugural YOU can be great here Community of Colleges series event with over 320 area college students and 40 AccessDubuqueJobs.com investors gathering for a Dubuque Fighting Saints Hockey game at the Dubuque Ice Arena. Organized by our Workforce Solutions team and sponsored by Greater Dubuque Development and the DRA, the evening was free for students and AccessDubuqueJobs.com investors to attend.

Designed to engage and connect our area college students to all that the Greater Dubuque region has to offer, Greater Dubuque Development is planning Community of Colleges events for the upcoming academic year. The series is now another tool in our Workforce Solutions toolbox to help employers recruit, retain, and develop talent now and into the future.

College Career & Internship Fair

Our annual AccessDubuqueJobs.com College Career & Internship Fair was a particular highlight of our college engagement efforts in 2022-2023. Held on March 29 at the Hotel Julien in downtown Dubuque, 200+ college students connected with more than 70 AccessDubuque|obs.com investors -- representing everything from manufacturing to hospitality to health care, IT, public safety, and so much more.

This yearly event goes beyond the typical job fair by providing opportunities to counsel with college career services staff, complimentary professional headshots, and professional development breakout sessions. The College Career & Internship Fair is open to all AccessDubuqueJobs.com investors at no additional cost. Students attend for free. Opportunity Dubuque

Opportunity Dubuque is a nationally recognized, collaborative job training effort developed and continually enhanced in response to local employers' needs for a skilled workforce.

Offered through Northeast Iowa Community College and partially funded through Greater Dubuque Development with support from the City of Dubuque, Dubuque County, and the DRA, the program currently offers training in 18 disciplines to fill high-demand and high-wage careers while providing coaches to help graduating students navigate the job market. Through this ongoing, time-tested initiative, individuals complete industry-driven certifications to upgrade their skills or launch their careers. A win-win for students and employers, Opportunity Dubuque builds career pathways for students to enter the workforce and continue their education and training, while filling employers' demand for talent.

A cornerstone of the Opportunity Dubuque program is a commitment to removing barriers such as costs associated with advancing one's education and the need for child care access when the student is also a parent. As traditional financial aid is not available for Opportunity Dubuque certicates, tuition is regularly subsidized and often free for qualifying students thanks to Greater Dubuque Development's investment. In addition, child care support is also available while students participate in select programs and upon graduation and full-time employment, graduates from select programs may qualify for an additional 12 months of child care support.

This award-winning workforce training initiative continues to adapt to the demands of our employers for skilled talent and, with our partners, we are constantly assessing community needs and programs offered. Since it's inception in 2012, we're proud to have worked with Northeast Iowa Community College to support 2,998 certificate completions as of June 2023.

BUSINESS SERVICES

InfoAction

InfoAction is Greater Dubuque Development's award-winning program for business retention and expansion rooted in old school basics, you give us the information, we act on it. In the last 12 months, out team has met one-on-one with over 300 employers in the Tri-State area in order to better understand what is going on at their place of business.

Based on these personal visits, our team, in collaboration with community partners, worked together to find real solutions to employer challenges. In 2022-2023, followup service was provided on issues from A to Z, large and small, on more than 247 occasions.

Aside from specific requests for assistance and expansion projects, Greater Dubuque Development relies on our InfoAction program to help shape the bigger picture. Training programs have been established, public policy has been developed or adjusted, infrastructure has been upgraded, transportation concerns have been addressed, and more.

In 2022-2023, based on the direct input from companies during InfoAction meetings, Greater Dubuque Development worked closely with our partners at Northeast Iowa Community College to develop the Professional Sales Certificate Program through Opportunity Dubuque.

The short-term Professional Sales Certificate Program was designed to support current sales professionals seeking to improve their sales skills or for others looking to enter this high demand field for the first time. The program and curriculum were created with the participation and direction of some of the same private-sector businesses that expressed the need for local access to this type of training during InfoAction meetings with our team. The inaugural Professional Sales Certificate class was completed in June 2023 with a new class launching in the Fall semester.

As area employers exceed their goals and strategize for growth, our team is there to help them navigate the challenges and maximize the opportunities that go hand in hand with the need for expansion. Whether building new or repurposing existing spaces, Greater Dubuque Development is there to identify resources at the local, state, and federal level while leveraging the strength of our partnerships with government, higher education, and the private sector to connect the dots so that expansion projects bring maximize benefit to the employee and our communities.

Expansions

• This fiscal year, **Seippel Warehouse**, LLC announced a build-to-suit 200,000 square foot warehouse expansion for Simmons Pet Food. Gronen, a partner in Seippel Warehouse, LLC, is leading the development and construction of the facility, breaking ground in May 2023.

• Originally established as a sheet metal shop in combination with a hardware store, **Geisler Brothers Company** has served regional heating, air conditioning, ventilation, roofing, and architectural sheet metal needs since 1892. Announced in October 2022, Geisler will expand their production space by an additional 7,200 square feet.

• For the second time in a decade **Green Industrial Supply, Inc.** is adding more space to its Dubuque Industrial Center West location. Our team had the privilege of assisting the company with its 2012 expansion, building a 142,000-square-foot corporate headquarters and production facility. With its latest expansion, Green Industrial Supply, Inc. is adding an additional 97,000 square feet to their facility.

The McCoy Group is one of four existing businesses, with assistance from Greater Dubuque Development Corporation, to plan or break ground on an expansion in the last fiscal year.

As one of North America's leading transportation companies, the McCoy Group is the parent company of five subsidiaries: Truck Country, Stoops Freightliner-Wester Star/Stoops Trailers, Foodliner, Quest Liner, and McCoy Construction & Forestry.

The McCoy Group was founded in 1958 by Robert McCoy in Shullsburg, Wisconsin. Since it's humble beginnings, the McCoy team has worked diligently and strategically to grow the business to one with international reach while remaining a family-owned and locally managed business. Headquartered in Dubuque since 1994, the McCoy Group now operates locations from coast to coast and in Mexico, employing nearly 4,000 team members.

With the planned expansion, the McCoy Group will continue with building upgrades to the office building at 501 Bell St and adjacent parking in the Port of Dubuque. "We are excited for the opportunity to offer this space to serve as our corporate office and the continued home of our tenants for years to come," says Greg McCoy, President & CEO of the McCoy Group. The project will also add the equivalent of 50 full-time jobs over the course of the next 36 months to the McCoy Group's Dubuque-based workforce, bringing the total number of local employees to 298 full-time positions.

We are grateful for this company's confidence and dedication to the Greater Dubuque region, including Greg McCoy's past service as a Greater Dubuque Development Board member. STRATEGIC INITIATIVES

At Greater Dubuque Development, our Strategic Initiatives team understands that our work is not only about responding to the challenges of today, but also preparing for those of tomorrow. From addressing child care needs to expanding broadband access and working with partners across the region, we are taking important steps that will ensure the Greater Dubuque area is a community of choice for years to come.

Child Care

Tremendous progress was made this year as we addressed one of the most significant challenges facing our regional employers and their employees, the ability to access affordable, flexible, and quality child care. Through our Strategic Initiatives work, Greater Dubuque Development relied on data, maximized resources, and facilitated collaboration to find solutions to child care needs confirmed by the 2021 Greater Dubuque Child Care Analysis commissioned by our Board of Directors.

Working throughout 2022-2023 with Dubuque Initiatives, a non-governmental, nonprofit consortium of public and private partners, Greater Dubuque Development assisted in identifying a location and funding in order to launch the creation of a multi-employer child care center at Dubuque Industrial Center West in the former Medline building at 7900 Chavenelle Road.

The center was one of just twenty-three projects in lowa to be awarded funds from the state's Child Care Business Incentive Grant program in September 2022, receiving \$2.158 million. This state investment was paired with the mission-oriented sale of the property by Medline to Dubuque Initiatives in December 2022 for \$2.5 million.

Following these announcements, Strake Johnson Architects was retained for design of a world-class child care center and Conlon Construction Co. is working to complete construction by December 2023. Once completed, the child care facility will be operated by the Dubuque Y in collaboration with the Dubuque Community School District to offer programs that blend child care and early learning, creating wrap around care that meets the needs of our growing workforce.

Child Care Professional Attraction Grant

Addressing the child care needs of our current and growing workforce requires a multi-pronged approach. In addition to creating additional child care slots with a focus on infant care, we also identified the need for additional qualified child care workers.

To address this need, Greater Dubuque Development leaned into our partnership with Northeast Iowa Community College to incentivize participation in Opportunity Dubuque's Child Care Level 1 career pathway certificate course.

In May 2023, the Greater Dubuque Child Care Professional Attraction grant was launched, offering \$1,000 grants to eligible child care workers entering the field and receiving training through Northeast Iowa Community College. To ensure success, these new child care professionals work with one of two Northeast Iowa Community College College and Career Coaches while receiving child care for their own childen during and following certificate completion for up to one year.

STRATEGIC INITIATIVES

Housing

We know housing is critical to our continued growth as a community. Greater Dubuque Development continues to collaborate with city government, developers, and builders to create new, affordable middle-market housing for the region's growing workforce.

Building on the 2022 Workforce Housing Study conducted by the East Central Intergovernmental Association and funded by Greater Dubuque Development, our Strategic Initiatives team works to address the insufficient supply of affordable housing in order to meet the needs and budgets of our expanding workforce.

Our efforts involve working with cities to advise in the development of additional incentives and flexible support to encourage increased activity by builders and developers. We also create and maintain maps of available properties and connect with the lowa Finance Authority to identify additional tools that can be leveraged to expand opportunities.

We're proud to continue support of projects such as Switch Homes, the Stacks, and Fox Hills as they've finalized agreements or broken ground on new housing stock in the past fiscal year. These projects and others are putting our region on track to address the need for 1,200 new housing units becoming available by 2030 in order to meet our workforce housing needs.

Broadband

Broadband expansion saw continued success through our public and private sector partnerships. By streamlining and simplifying processes, the initiative has doubled conduit, quadrupled fiber, and increased the number of providers in the Greater Dubuque region from two to ten. We are on track to achieve universal access throughout Dubuque by the end of 2024.

Greater Dubuque thanks ImOn Communications for its continued collaboration in these efforts and appluads them for their June 2023 announcement of a new \$100,000 corporate giving program to support area non-profits in the coming year.

Transportation

Removing barriers to ensure our current and future workforce can travel from home to work and back again is critical to supporting our employers and their employees. We work closely with partners and transportation providers to develop, pilot and fund solutions that fill gaps through innovative transportation solutions.

In 2022-2023, Greater Dubuque Development collaborated with the City of Dubuque, The Jule, and area employers to develop and fund a pilot program offering commuter specific rides at no cost to employers or the employees. Routes were designed to align with various shift schedules, support major employers, and account for employment related transportation needs and challenges faced by many current and potential employees.

Dubuque was ranked in the top 100 best places to live in the U.S. in a report done by Livability. The annual study calculated a 'LivScore' for over 2,300 cities using data points based on each city's amenities, economy, demographics, housing, social and civic capital, education, health care, transportation, infrastructure, and remote readiness. The final 100 cities are considered welcoming, affordable and offer the space and opportunity to grow, both professionally and personally.
